a. **Assessment Dates.** In alignment with MOE's guidelines, the school will be conducting the following assessments for our students in 2026. The school will continue with bite-sized weighted assessments to check students' understanding and provide timely feedback. Absences during assessments, due to medical reasons, must be covered by valid medical certificates. Medical certificates from Chinese physicians will not be accepted. Absences not covered by valid medical certificates would warrant a zero mark for the assessment (as per Student Handbook). 6. **School Safety.** School Safety is fundamental to the well-being of staff and students in carrying out their duties and participating in learning activities respectively. We adopt a **whole-school approach** where we collaborate with our stakeholders to improve school safety.

#### Personal and Social Responsibility

We seek parents' support to keep our school a safe environment for students. If your child is unwell, please ensure that he/she stays at home and seeks medical attention if necessary. If your child is recovering from respiratory-related illnesses, please encourage him/her to exercise social responsibility (e.g., by wearing a mask, minimising social interactions with big groups). We appreciate your support in this. Let us all do our part to exercise personal and social responsibility and stay safe.

#### Road Safety

We would like to thank parents who drive their children to school for your attention to pedestrian safety in the school vicinity. We would like to remind that **Gate H along the stretch of Serangoon Road is only for pedestrian access and not for alighting or boarding of vehicles**. Stopping your vehicle outside Gate H poses potential safety hazard to other road users. Land Transport Authority is monitoring the illegal parking situation at Gate H and will intensify the patrol by their Enforcement Officers when necessary. We encourage these motorists to make use of the nearby public carparks (at Beng Wan Road and Blk 45) that lead to the school side gate (Gate A).

We would also like to highlight the risks of Jaywalking, especially across multiple vehicle lanes of Bendemeer Road. School has regularly reminded students to use the overhead bridge for their safety. Please see attached Appendix for the **Traffic Police Advisory on Jaywalking** in the vicinity of Bendemeer Primary School.

In addition, we seek parents' understanding that during dismissal period **from 1.30pm to 2.00pm, only school authorized buses will be allowed into the school**. Drop-off or pick-up by private vehicles can be done at the nearby public carparks. We thank you for your cooperation in enhancing school safety.

7. **Home-School Partnership.** We believe it is important to foster a strong relationship between parents and teachers so as to support students' holistic development. We value your commitment in supporting our students' learning (please see **Annex C** for guides on better home-school partnership). Thus, we would like to extend our invitation to you to be part of our Bendemeer Parent Support Group (PSG) family. As a PSG member, you will get to immerse in the school learning environment by participating in regular school programmes opened to the PSG. Parents will work closely with the Teachers-in-charge to ensure the programmes are implemented safely and effectively. The school leaders, together with the PSG officer in-charge, will also interact with the PSG members on a regular basis.
